The Armistice Shoot: 13 - 14 November 2010 At the Marks, at Speed and in the Cloth of Gold

Scotney Castle is open to the longbow. Superlative shooting ground in parkland and gardens set around the ruins of a 14th Century moated castle. The shoot is by kind permission of the National Trust and the Warden Mr Joe Lloyd.

Scotney Castle is easily reached along the A21 Sevenoaks by-pass; Dover 70 mins, London 60 mins, Gatwick 50 mins. The Estate has two streams, is planted with mature well maintained trees and commands a magnificent outlook across the Kent countryside
